NIGHTINGALE AND THE TOWER is an electronic Chamber Opera created for six professional adult singers from the Opera world, twenty Youth Company members, ages 7-18, orchestra, synthesizers and earth harp. Combining elements of digital and acoustic sounds, this pioneering new work from groundbreaking classical composer, Jason Treuting, Grammy Award Winning folk-rock musician, Mikael Jorgensen and vocal visionary, Rebecca Comerford, melds the elements of a rich neo-classical score, alongside electronic and synthesized textures to create a bold, multi-disciplinary work of art never before seen.

THIS IS A STORY ABOUT the delicate balance children must tread between technology and the environment, in a dystopian world that no longer seeks value in nature or it's wild and beautiful imperfections.

edge of a deep forest. Inside this forest, a Nightingale is born, heralding the dawn of a new epoch in time. However, this mythical bird is born with a broken wing and does not possess the ability to fly. An oracle witnesses as the bird is birthed into existence and explains that her birth is an omen to all who encounter her that the new dawn of the digital age is upon them. At the edge of this forest is a house where ten-year-old Teo lives with his single mother, Sandra, alongside his neighbors Margot, Annalise and Leah, their parents Liza and John, and a troubled young man named Rusty and his ill-tempered father, Pete, who is raising him alone. Teo's spinal chord is paralyzed due to an accident he had when he was a little boy and as a result he must use

a wheelchair to get around. Despite his disability, he has a grace and quiet strength that motivates all his actions and decision making, causing him to appear less earthbound and more guided by an angelic realm. As Teo and the neighborhood children walk home from school one day, they decide to take the shortcut through the forbidden forest. When they do, they stumble upon the newly born Nightingale, struggling to move under the weight of her broken wing. These kids who spend little time in nature, with the exception of Teo, are unsure of what to do with the wounded bird. When Rusty throws stones at it, Teo defends the bird and makes it his mission to rescue the animal and rehabilitate it to flying once more. What ensues from there is an odyssey into the deepest part of the forest where Teo encounters a giant super Tower that holds all the collective consciousness of humanity, run by a mercurial Empress and two twin princesses that serve as programmers for the technological Id. After encountering the Tower, Teo is forced to question everything he was ever taught about the natural world around him. In order to save the Nightingale, he must reveal the existence of the Tower to his mother and the other parents of the village, who remain ignorant of its whereabouts. Together, the children form an unlikely bond to save the Nightingale and in turn, encounter the truth about themselves and the adults in their lives, who are at times flawed by the very technology they seek to use. If they can heal the Nightingale, they can restore harmony between the natural world and the everadvancing forces of technology that seek to consume their world. By doing so, they can heal themselves.




Rebecca Comerford

Hailed by Variety Magazine as a "standout character actress" in the cult classic comedy, The Living Wake, as "the future of lyric theatre in America" by Classical Voice Magazine, and "brilliant" by the New York Times, Rebecca Comerford's voice and sincere dramatic intensity has been felt in concert halls, theatres and movie screens across America and Europe. As a concert soloist she has performed in such venues as Carnegie Hall, Avery Fischer Hall/Lincoln Center, The J. Paul Getty Museum, Symphony Space, The Orpheum Theatre Memphis, Vienna Staastoper and Aspen Music Festival. Her latest one-woman show "Songs of Resistance and Rebellion" recently made it's debut at New York City's iconic Neue Galerie as part of the Café Sabarsky Cabaret Series, with collaborator and Broadway Music Director, Anna Dagmar on the piano. As an actor she has been seen in such films as the SXSW Audience Winner, Explicit IIIs, opposite the Roots frontman, Taria Trotter, Iranian filmmaker Shirin Neshat's experimental short, Issar, The Living Wake, opposite Academy Award nominee Jesse Eisenberg and as a writer, composer and lead in the period western, Sulphur Mountain. In addition to her original compositions and librettos, Rebecca co-founded Ojai Youth Opera Company in 2014, the first autonomous youth opera theatre in America, dedicated to telling original stories with a socially conscious message for youth. OYO has brought some of the best and brightest in the Opera field to mentor young singers ages 7-18 to the idillic Ojai Valley every summer. These artists include Metropolitan Opera star, Falk Struckmann, Metropolitan Opera director Louisa Muller, contralto Nicole Mitchell and conductor, **Kostis Protopapas.**



Jason Treuting

Acknowledged worldwide, Jason Treuting's accomplishments as composer and performer are staggering. As a performer, he has collaborated with artists as diverse as David Lang, Steve Reich, John Zorn, tabla master Zakir Hussein, electronic music duo Matmos, rock band The National, and choreographer Eliot Field. He has been a featured performer with the LA Philharmonic, BAM, Live from Lincoln Center Festival, DOM Moscow, The Walker Art Center, Le National Montréal, and the Ojai Music Festival, to name a few. His many compositions have been featured at the Kennedy Center, The Brooklyn Academy of Music New Wave Festival, The League of Composers Orchestra, The Whitney Museum, and Lincoln Center. Jason's music has been featured on NPR's Weekend Edition, as well as WNYC's Sound-Check and Evening Music. His first CD with **So Percussion**, "Amid the Noise," was chosen as a top ten album of the year by All About Jazz and "Spring" from QQQ's Unpacking the Trailer was selected as track of the week by USA Today. His music is recorded on Cantaloupe Music and New Amsterdam Records. He has been featured as composer-in-residence at the Carlsbad Music Festival and the Canberra International Music Festival, Australia. Ojai Youth Opera is thrilled to premiere Treuting's opera as our first original score. Treuting is a graduate of Eastman School of Music and Yale University.



Mikael Jorgensen

Ojai's own Mikael Jorgensen is a long time member of the revered indie rock band Wilco, for which he has won multiple Grammy awards. As an electronic musician, Mikael began his career apprenticing under his father, a Danish recording engineer whose passion for music and all its production arts inspired his son. His wide-ranging education, including studies in fine arts, video, electronics, and computer science, provided him an extraordinary base for his work as a master of modern-digital and retro-analog production. Mikael joined Wilco in 2002 to perform real-time sound manipulations. He gradually moved to the stage itself, manning his laptop as well as taking on more and more keyboard duties. Wilco's numerous industry awards include seven Grammy nominations, winning two for the 2005 release, A Ghost is Born. Mikael was a featured Artist for Ventura's own Focus on the Masters series in 2017. Jorgensen will be joining OYO as a guest artist faculty member and as the wizard behind our electronic score manipulations for the Education Outreach performances and world premiere.



Beth Meyers

Arranger, Beth Meyers is a founding member of janus (flute/viola/harp trio) whose debut album i am not was called "gorgeously subtle" (NPR's Studio 360). Through her more than 12 years of collaboration, janus has commissioned over one hundred new works for the trio repertoire. She is also a founding member of the quirky folk-prog band, QQQ (viola, hardanger fiddle, acoustic guitar and drums) whose debut album Unpacking the Trailer (also New Amsterdam Records) was hailed "a bold statement of purpose disguised as an unpretentious lark" (Time Out New York). Beth has performed with ensembles and artists including ACME Ensemble, Alarm Will Sound, Antony and the Johnsons, Chromeo, Clare and The Reasons, Da Capo Chamber Players, Ensemble ACJW, Kishibashi, Matmos, Meredith Monk, Pierre Boulez, Theater of a Two-Headed Calf, Frank Ocean, John Legend, Rochester Philharmonic, the Roots, Signal, Regina Spektor, So Percussion, Steve Reich, Sufjan Stevens, Theo Bleckman, the Ying Quartet and the Princeton Symphony Orchestra. Beth is a graduate of the Eastman School of Music. Currently, Beth spends a good deal of her playing in NYC where she is the violist for Wicked and can be heard in various contemporary music ensembles. Her daily creative energy is focused on playing banjo, ukelele and singing in her new duo project, Damsel with guitarist/singer, Monica Mugan.

This project also seeks to question how much time we spend in the natural world, and how much we stand to lose, should we choose to ignore these changes.



We believe, through the spirit of youth, the transformative art form of Opera awakens the authentic expression of humanity and keeps it alive.
